Time is a funny thing, isn't it? Aimee (Salem's finance manager) and I were just talking about how quickly November sped by. Then, January feels like it's 6,293 days long. Most would agree that summers are never long enough. December, well that remains to be measured. Time is a funny thing.

There's two words for "time" in Greek. "Kronos" is where we get chronology from – the steady tick of the clock, the sunrises and sunsets that mark our days, the phases of the moon, and our orbit around the sun. It is measured, it is sure, it is observable.

"Kairos" is about the right moment when everything lines up. It is kairos when the deer walks into the clearing and the crosshairs line up and you exhale before squeezing. It's a retreat, a vacation, or a moment when you breathe deep and soak in what's around you and feel truly, deeply refreshed. It's an adult child, having their own life experiences, who comes back to you with a word of thanks or apology. It's an addict who has bottomed out who finally succeeds in sobriety. Kairos can't be planned, it can't be forced, it can't even be predicted. Kairos is God's time.

Galatians talks about kairos time. In chapter 3, Paul writes about God's gift of Law that guides humanity's actions but also points out our flaws and our need for a savior. In chapter 4, he writes, "But when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children."

There were lots of other times when God could have interrupted our world with Christ's presence. Lots of suffering, lots of wars, lots of troubles where people cried out for saving. It was that moment, that kairos moment in history, when governments and expectations and hopes and fears lined up. Into that waiting world, a baby was born who is Christ the Lord.

Good news! Great joy!

In this season of Advent, we are waiting and watching and praying and hoping for the day when things of this world line up for another kairos moment. When that fullness of time comes and Christ returns, may we be found ready, watchful, and trusting that our God knows just the right moment to reveal our hope.

Church Council News

Advent and Christmas Blessings to you,

Last January the Council spent a day identifying Strategy Objectives for our church to be accomplish and how to measure the success. One of the areas was to improve communication of council activities. Two update/listening sessions have been held. I am beginning a monthly newsletter article as another way to improve communication. We did a progress check in August and will be evaluating the progress again this January.

To increase church visibility in the community, a summer Block Party and Battle of the Bands was held in our parking lot. We continue to host Trunks for Treats for the community. Salem also organizes the annual Cantata and invites churches and individuals to join us.

Another Objective was to develop adult education opportunities. A Wednesday afternoon and a Tuesday evening Bible Studies have been added this year. A session on Charitable Giving was offered by the Capital Appeal Team with a representative of the ELCA Foundation.

In order meet the objective to reduce organizational risk, an insurance audit was done, and a financial audit is in process.

To develop creative worship experiences, we worshipped in the park on Serpent Lake one Sunday last summer. In November, we sung the liturgy. We are joining with Cascade Methodist Church for a Thanksgiving Eve Service at 6 PM.

Another objective was to Activate Lay-Lead Volunteer Teams. Salem Outreach received the Global Humanitarian Award from the Brainerd Lakes Area Community Foundation for their work in Honduras. In April 2025, another team will be going to Honduras. If you are interested in information, contact Don Hales. We are also in the process or re-organizing Salem's Home Communion Visitors to reach those who are homebound.

Thank you to all of you who volunteer and serve generously in so many diverse ways to carry out Salem's Mission to **Welcome** people to Jesus Christ, **Equip** them with a faith that works in their lives, and **Send** them into the world in Jesus' name. In this Advent season, there are so many opportunities to be Jesus hands and feet to those in our community and the world. The Salem Lutheran Church Council designated any special Thanksgiving offering to ELCA World Hunger. As we celebrate bountiful meals with family and friends, we also want to help those who do not have enough food. Our special Christmas offerings will be sent to Lutheran World Relief. LWR is providing aid to those suffering droughts, climate disasters, economic instability, and refugees of war.


2024-2027

WEATHER CANCELLATION POLICY

For Salem Lutheran Church and Salem Outreach

Adopted by Council February 23, 2023

- 1. First and foremost: If the weather is bad enough to question whether or not Worship is canceled, please err on the side of safety and stay at home.
- 2. The Pastor or Council President will determine church closures. The Director of Outreach or Council President will determine outreach closures.
- 3. In the case of inclement weather on a weekend, the decision about worship cancellation will be made by 7:00 a.m. Sunday morning.
- 4. The Pastor will make changes to the church phone message, website, and social media (Facebook and Instagram).
- 5. People in the congregation are encouraged to call the church for a voicemail message or check online church communications (listed in 3.) for weather related announcements.
- 6. Each group (Circle, Bible Study Group, Committee, etc) is responsible for informing the group of cancellations due to the weather.

Senior Fellowship Meals

Salem has received a grant to organize a monthly community meal for individuals with similar life experiences to connect and combat post-pandemic loneliness and social isolation. The free meal and gathering space will promote connection and fellowship through interactive card and board game activities.

This open-ended social afternoon fosters fellowship and connectedness without any pressure, program, or agenda, allowing for conversations and coffee to continue as long as attendees are comfortable.
