In our journey of faith, one of the most profound and important things we can do is ask questions. Whether we're new to the Christian faith or have been walking with God for many years, asking questions is an essential part of growing in our faith. It opens us to the Spirit's direction, humbles us, and joins us in more authentic community.

In 2019, I spent a couple weeks in a Benedictine monastery in Madison while on sabbatical. One of the things that surprised me was listening to the 80-year-old Prioress talk about her faith "as a beginner." Even 61 years into her vows, she didn't have God or faith all figured out. She listened to our group of pastors like we had something to teach her. She asked questions, she started a lot of Bible studies with "I wonder", and she named a few of her doubts with us.

I felt relieved. So much of our western mindset values certainty and quick answers and experts and full knowledge, and it's a standard that we can't live by when it comes to faith. God has given us curious minds and hearts that seek to understand. Look at how many times the disciples asked for the meaning of Jesus' parables. God invites us in Jeremiah 29:13: "When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart, I will let you find me, says the Lord..."

We all have questions when it comes to faith – lots about the meaning of Bible verses, some about how we worship, more about the differences between Christian beliefs, a few about Communion and children, and at least one question about when we light the Christ candle.

We talk about these things in Confirmation classes, long before we actually care about the answers. So let's take some time in this extended "ordinary time" of Epiphany to ask the questions and seek deeper insight. Let's collect our curiosities and learn from one another and be open to growing in our faith!

I've been collecting questions about Communion (open table, children serving, why only pastors preside), about saying we believe in "the holy catholic church" when we're Lutherans, and why we baptize babies when they don't have the ability to believe.

I can guess at the things you're wondering about – or you can simply ask. So, ask away! Send me an email, write a note and drop in the offering plate, or show up to our Tuesdays with an "I wonder." If I know your questions ahead of time, I can prepare some resources and group similar topics – but note, I don't have answers. I have theologies and traditions and musings and perspective – same as you. So let's learn from one another, and "be equipped with a faith that works in our lives."

I'll see you Tuesday nights at 6:30 from January 21 through February 18!

Dear Salem Family and Friends,

Thank you to all of you who contributed a Christmas offering. The Salem Church Council designated that offering to Lutheran World Relief. Their last mailing highlighted some ways LWR puts "your love in action around the world" - Food, clothing, education for children, seeds to grow crops in Nepal and Central America, quilts to those experiencing disasters in Ukraine and the US, medical aid and clean water in Africa were projects described.

I encourage you to celebrate Epiphany as part of your Christmas celebration. In many parts of the world, gifts are not given until January 6th when the arrival of the Magi (Wise Men) in Bethlehem. I always think that this allows the focus of Christmas to be on the arrival of Christ and not what is in stockings and under the tree. Children in some countries put their shoes by the door, filled with straw for the camels as we might leave cookies for Santa. Reflect on the gifts and blessings that we have received from God in the last year.

#### For Salem Lutheran Church and Salem Outreach

Adopted by Council February 23, 2023

- 1. First and foremost: If the weather is bad enough to question whether or not Worship is canceled, please err on the side of safety and stay at home.
- 2. The Pastor or Council President will determine church closures. The Director of Outreach or Council President will determine outreach closures.
- 3. In the case of inclement weather on a weekend, the decision about worship cancellation will be made by 7:00 a.m. Sunday morning.
- 4. The Pastor will make changes to the church phone message, website, and social media (Facebook and Instagram).
- 5. People in the congregation are encouraged to call the church for a voicemail message or check online church communications (listed in 3.) for weather related announcements.
- 6. Each group (Circle, Bible Study Group, Committee, etc) is responsible for informing the group of cancellations due to the weather.
